'71 Symphony Band European Tour Reunion

In May 1971, having just completed his thirty-sixth and final year as the Michigan Director of Bands, Dr. William D. Revelli took the Symphony Band on a four week tour of Europe. Following performances in England, Germany, Italy and France, a final concert was given in majestic Carnegie Hall in New York.

Memories of that memorable and exciting month were relived on Saturday June 14, 2008, as half of that outstanding hundred-member group came together in Ann Arbor for what was quickly dubbed "Reunion 2". Reunion 1 had occurred in 1993, 22 years after the tour. This had been a particularly poignant meeting, as Dr. Revelli died

thirteen months later, often recalling during that time how significant that particular band had been. Never ones to be tied to traditional reunion anniversary dates, the group decided to reconvene this year, marking the 37th anniversary of the trip.

Festivities began mid-morning in the rehearsal hall at the School of Music, Theatre, and Dance. With pictures, posters, and other tour memorabilia

The Michigan Bands Welcome Dr. Pasquale

Dr. John D. Pasquale has been named the University of Michigan Assistant Director of Bands where he serves as Associate Director of the Michigan Marching and Athletic Bands, Director of the Michigan Hockey Band, Conductor of the Campus and University Bands, and teach undergraduate conducting.

In addition to his responsibilities at the University of Michigan, Dr. Pasquale is a member of the Brass Staff of the Cavaliers Drum and Bugle Corps from Rosemont, Illinois, where he teaches ensemble music and is a brass pedagogy specialist. Through his teaching at the Cavaliers, Pasquale is a contributor to

the instructional DVD entitled The Cavaliers Brass: From the Concert Hall to the Football Field, which has been met with international acclaim. During his tenure since 2002 the Cavaliers have been three times Drum Corps International World Champions and the recipient of the Jim Ott Award for Excellence in Brass Performance.

Receiving the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Conducting from the University of Oklahoma at Norman in 2008, Dr. Pasquale served as a conducting associate to the Wind Symphony, Opera Orchestra, "The Pride of Oklahoma" Marching Band, New Century Ensemble, Faculty Composer Concert Series, Symphony Band, Concert Band, and the Weitzenhoffer Family Department of Musical Theatre. In addition, he was an adjunct instructor and graduate teaching assistant within the Music Education Department. He holds a Master of Music degree in Instrumental Conducting from the University of Oklahoma and a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas.

Prior to attending the University of Oklahoma, Dr. Pasquale conducted an internationally recognized and competitive middle school Wind Ensemble holding the position of Director of Bands at Griffin Middle School in The Colony, Texas, within the Lewisville Independent School District. During his four year assignment, Pasquale was the 2001, 2002 and 2003 recipient of the "Making A Difference Award" given by the student body of Griffin Middle School and received the 2003 nomination for Griffin Middle School "Teacher of the Year."

Dr. Pasquale remains in demand as an adjudicator, clinician, and pedagogue in secondary school band programs throughout the country.

UMBAA hosted the 1971 Symphony Band European Tour Reunion over the weekend of June 14, 2008.





to be unnecessary, and started conversing, almost as if they had not been away from each other those many years.

After a couple of hours, the group sat down for an "open mike" session. Following some welcoming remarks from Director of Bands Michael Haithcock, the plan was for each person to tell, in a minute or less, about what they had been doing through the years. The format changed rapidly as many in the group felt an urge to also tell a favorite story, or two, about their years in the band. Mixed with the laughter and tears, the morning session went well beyond the planned ending time of noon.

A large portion of the group accepted an invitation from oboist Ellen Sudia to continue the merriment at her home in nearby Pittsfield Township. The morning discussions continued seamlessly into and throughout the afternoon,

just at a different location.

The day's activities concluded with a banquet in the Pendleton Room at the Michigan Union. Among the special guests were the only two surviving members of the Revelli wind faculty – John Mohler (clarinet) and Keith Bryan (flute) who also brought his wife, former piano professor Karen Keyes. In addition, several surviving widows of wind faculty were able to attend – Glennis Stout (Louis Stout, horn), Mary Teal (Larry Teal, saxophone), and Louise Hauenstein (Nelson Hatenstein, flute).

Festivities at the banquet included a trip down memory lane with a slide show recap of the tour. Special moments from Reunion 1 were recalled on video. A highlight of that reunion had been a playing rehearsal of the group. Revelli had some endearing comments to make to the band then, and his presence on the screen made it seem as if his spirit was still with us. That session

had ended with him conducting the complete *Victors*, which as it turned out, was the last time he ever did that. Fortunately, it was a moment recorded for posterity.

Upon vacating the Pendleton Room, many stood in the lobby for nearly an hour – unable to tear themselves away. A mere fifteen hours was simply not enough for a group that had experienced so much together, and plans were already being tossed out about when to schedule the next reunion.

There are thousands of Michigan bandsmen, each with his or her own fond memories, laughter, and tears of those glorious college days. The 1971 European Tour Band is one that likes to think it had something really special, something it likes to sum up in one word – Bolzano – a word that derives from . . . a word that represents . . . a word that has come to mean . . . well, you just had to be there!!

A Legacy Project – Building a Master Roster

A major project has begun to build a "master roster" which will list anybody who was ever a member of a Michigan Band. **You** can help by searching your old college boxes and attics [and especially those of your grandparents] to help collect the names of the members. There are many sources of information but most of them are lacking crucial information: i.e. a block band roster from the 1940s MMB listing only last names, and the same for concert sets showing seating for the sections of the band. If you have any materials or know of somebody who may have old band materials especially from 1950 back please photocopy them and mail them to the Band Hall, attention UMBAA Historian or scan them and email them to umbaa-historian@umich.edu Some of the most helpful items are concert programs, band member rosters, and travel lists.

Leslie Bassett, U-M composition professor emeritus and former member of the Concert Band (pre Symphony Band) was given the first award in 2004. H. Robert Reynolds, former U-M director of bands, received the award in 2005 and Fred Ormand, U-M clarinet professor and Symphony Band member in the 1950s, received the award in the 2006-2007 school year.



A History of the University of Michigan Bands

Chapter Six

Neither Blare of Trumpets Nor Clanging of Cymbals

uring the waning years of the 19th Century, the University of Michigan Band was essentially a warm weather organization—from and visitors; any music that was the time after the final football game in November until late March, the band generally did not meet or perform. In the spring, after weeks of inactivity, the band would gather its members together and prepare for a busy schedule of performances at athletic and social events. The high point of the University's spring social calendar was Commencement Week—usually during the latter part of June. It was a time when the band could be found performing daily for class reunions, dances, baseball games, swing-out parades, class days, and the freshman cap night. During Commencement Week,

the most important activity was the actual graduation ceremony which was held in the auditorium of University Hall. Due to space limitations, there was only enough room for the graduates, faculty, needed was provided by the University's large pipe organ. Prior to the commencement ceremony, there was a traditional march of the graduates down the "diag" to University Hall. For this occasion, a professional band from Detroit was usually hired to provide the music. Eventually, the a band of around thirty-six University recognized the worthiness of its own band, and at the commencement processional in June 1900, the Michigan, "playing a spirited march," performed this duty for the first time.

Of course it was during the fall months when at the football games that the band received its

greatest exposure. Just what the Michigan Band did at the football games has been preserved in a colorful account written by a band member, Burton C. Poston, fiftythree years after these events took place. "I entered the U. of M. in the fall of 1899. Having played in a number of bands before entering college, I made application to join the college band and was accepted as solo cornetist. I played with the band for two years. The second year, I was elected manager of both band and orchestra. We had members having been selected from more than four hundred applicants. For its size, we had a good band. We made many trips with various teams. The first one I remember was to Chicago with the football team in the fall of '99. In those days, the part the band played was quite different than it is today. Our band room was in



Waterman Gym. About an hour before the game, we would gather at the gym, get our instruments, form on North University, march to State Street and then south to Ferry Field. When we entered the field, we would march around the field once, playing *The Victors*. After that, we took our place in the grand stand remaining there until the game was over. Between halves, we would play several numbers and after the game, march back up State Street."

During the fall of 1900, a new leader took charge of the band— Allen Lynn Darr, a student in the Department of Literature, Science, and the Arts. A native of Tacoma, Washington, he played solo cornet in the Michigan Band for two years prior to his appointment as director; he had also served as the band's president. As A. Lynn Darr took over the directorship from Ray Warren, the membership of the band was made up entirely of students; musicians from off campus were no longer needed. Harry de Pont, the band's founder who was still a member, described the type of music that Darr conducted: "The class of music was the best. marches ran into the fourth and fifth grades, short concert numbers were well selected, and heavy overtures were of high class."

Gradually, the band's unique contribution to the musical life of the campus was acknowledged by the official University community. In 1899, the Athletic Association

announced that it would pay each band member five dollars for every football game that the band attended. As the band became a regular feature at the weekly Mass Meetings, Darr ordered special arrangements of such campus favorites as Hot Time in the Old Town Tonight and The Yellow and Blue to encourage more spirited singing. (It should be noted that during this time, The Victors was not played by the band.) When the Michigan football team traveled to Columbus for the gridiron meeting with Ohio State, the Daily encouraged Darr's musicians to greet the boisterous Buckeyes and "show them we have a band!" In 1901, the band accompanied the team to Columbus and "led the five hundred Michigan rooters" and "responded several times during the game."

During the Darr years, the Friday night Mass Meetings were well attended, but sometimes the enthusiasm and behavior of the students got our of hand which caused President Angell on one occasion to cancel the event for "fear of crowd trampling." It was at a Mass Meeting in November 1901 when Professor Thomas Trueblood introduced his famous "Michigan Locomotive" cheer. With shouts of "Rah! Rah! Rah! Rah! Michigan! Michigan!", the "locomotive" cheer would begin slowly, then accelerate like "puffs of smoke." Professor Trueblood believed that his "Michigan Locomotive" cheer was easier on the voice than the traditional

"Michigan Yell".

The band was still faced with financial insecurity. Out of town trips were financed by soliciting funds on campus. In November 1899, there was not enough money to send the entire band to Chicago for the Michigan-Wisconsin game. Undeterred, the entire band boarded the train in spite of the fact that they were short of funds, and en route to Chicago, band members passed the hat among the passengers who were Michigan fans and raised the necessary money. Discouraged by the constant problem of not having enough money to conduct the band's affairs, the members of the band met in Waterman Gymnasium on March 6, 1902 and unanimously voted to disband.

News of the break up was "received with regret by the student body" for it was widely felt that "no organization on the campus has rendered the University more faithful service." In reaction to this crisis, the *Daily* declared that a "football game without a band would have seemed an incomplete affair." In an impassioned editorial, the *Daily* argued that "the band should not be paid such miserly sums" and that it was time for "an official bandmaster." It was pointed out that at Northwestern University and at the University of Wisconsin, band members were given half tuition for their services. When William Jennings Bryan arrived in Ann Arbor to

speak at the annual Washington's Birthday observance, the absence of the band was described as "inexcusable."

To save the band, an urgent Mass Meeting was held on March 12, 1902, and a collection was taken. Even a member of the University's Board of Regents sent a contribution of five dollars. It was suggested that the Athletic Association provide for the band's band-music loving population on needs, and in return, the band would be required to offer its services at the games and meets. As a result of these efforts, Darr gathered the band members together, and rehearsals were once again held in Waterman Gym. In April the band resumed its public performances when it took part in a "Western" parade on State Street—complete with stage coach, students dressed as cowboys and Indians—which promoted a "county fair" sponsored by some of the campus fraternities.

The autumn of 1902 found the Michigan Band "in shape" and "on hand at the proper times with the goods." Giving credit to A. Lynn Darr for the band's success, the Daily noted that "the band is now in better form than it has ever been at this early date, and prospects indicate a strong organization." The future seemed bright, and the Daily confirmed this belief with the observation that the band was "improving weekly and rapidly increasing in size, and proved there is nothing like a good band to keep rooters

stirred up."

This optimism was short lived as another financial crisis arose, and again, the band decided to break up. For the last two home games in November, the band did not play. This absence was the cause of much concern as reflected in an editorial in the December 1902 issue of the Michigan Alumnus: "The band musicians and the the Campus have been suffering their own woes. The trouble began when the athletic management found itself unable to take the Band to Wisconsin game in Chicago. Student subscriptions were solicited, and the Band was taken on the trip and did its share towards the success of the side-line part of the game. Whatever effort has been made to preserve the organization since that time has been fruitless. and all the later games, except that on Thanksgiving Day, there has been neither blare of trumpets nor clanging of cymbals. The lack of the band is a distinct loss to the pleasure of the game. Those students, whose University career extends back to the time before the Band was organized, realize more than those, who have never known the University without the Band, the value of this organization to the spirit of the Campus. It is to be hoped that by some means, the Band may be reorganized and preserved."

The lack of financial support may not have been the only issue that caused the disbanding.

Information provided by Anthony M. Arnston, solo clarinet of the 1902 band, reveals that the break up was caused by dissension from within the band. In a letter to the Michigan Band Alumni Association written in 1950, Arnston revealed that "the du Puys [sic de Ponts], who dominated the membership because they lived there [Ann Arbor permanently—three sons of a French instructor—were determined to make it a commercial affair, for their financial benefit, while we, the majority of the organization, wished to continue it as a college activity."

In December, the problem seemed to be solved when the band reached an agreement with the Athletic Association which attributed the band's financial woes to the band's officers. The agreement suggest that band members, rather than receive payment for their services should be given free admission to the games. Uniforms and music would be provided; a faculty manager would be appointed to oversee the band's business concerns. There was agreement, in principle, that the band's trips to away games ought to be funded. Despite the appeal by the Athletic Director, Charles Baird, the Board of Regents rejected these recommendations. It appeared that there would not be to the a solution band's problems.



Regional Alumni Band Guidelines





- Each local alumni band unit will have a designated director to coordinate the local band. The director will be

- 2. The director will be the liaison to the UMBAA to maintain contact and get any support measures needed that are available from the UMBAA or directly from the University of Michigan Bands.
- 3. Good instrumental balance is essential in assuring a good performance that reflects well on the talent of the local band members.
- 4. Performances should be of a nature that reflect positively on the local alumni band unit and on the University of Michigan Band program.
- 5. All members of a local alumni band unit are encouraged to rehearse before scheduled events and garner support for the University of Michigan Bands from their local alumni clubs when possible.
- 6. All members of a local alumni band unit are strongly encouraged to help support the University of Michigan Band Alumni Association by becoming active supporting members (members in good standing).
- 7. The Michigan Marching Band Director will provide any music requested that is traditionally a "Michigan" piece if the Board of Regents holds copyright. Any other requested pieces will need to be purchased by the local band.
