# 40th Anniversary Reunion 1969 University of Michigan Marching Band

Is your name on this list? (See the next page) If so, you are invited to come back "home" to Ann Arbor on September 26, 2009 for a special  $40^{th}$  **Anniversary Reunion** of the

1969 University of Michigan Marching Band.

For many reasons, 1969 was a special year for the Michigan Band. It was Bo Schembechler's first year as Michigan's head football coach, and we witnessed the beginning of the era of Michigan football dominance in the Big Ten when the Wolverines upset "The Team of the Century", the Buckeyes of OSU. It was in 1969 when Drum Major, Mark Brown, began the tradition of the back bend now part of every Michigan Band pregame. The "Peace Show" was a dramatic statement that was seen on national TV during the height of the Vietnam War which resulted in over 4,000 letters and telegrams sent from across the country. The tradition of the pre-game "floating" Block M began 40 years ago. And, we all have memories of the '70 Rose Bowl. These and many more Michigan Band "firsts" made the '69 Marching Band one of the most exciting in Michigan Band history. Of course, at the time, none of this seemed significant as we were just trying to survive the everyday demands of William Revelli and George Cavender!

This year, on September 26, a special day is being planned for all the members of the great Michigan Marching Band of 1969. Detailed information will be forthcoming. But for now, here are a few bits of information so that you can make your plans to "come home" to Ann Arbor.

- Due to the home game schedule, Homecoming this year is earlier than usual—September 26 when Michigan meets Indiana. It will be a noon kickoff.
- Our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary reunion will be part of the Michigan Band Alumni Association annual "Blast from the Past". In a sense, we will have a special reunion within a reunion.
- For the pregame march across the field, members of the '69 Michigan Marching Band will be in the front ranks.
- Besides the usual schedule of the day for the "Blast from the Past", we will have a special dinner that will be catered. This dinner will be held in the Central Campus area at 6 p.m.
- At this dinner, we will view the half time from the M-OSU "Peace Show", the film "Marching for Roses", and footage of a rehearsal on Wines Field. Certainly, there will be no shortage of memories and stories. Family and friends are welcome to attend the dinner/program.

A special anniversary T-shirt will be issued. And, perhaps, a 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Rose Bowl patch.

Remember, to participate you must complete the regular membership/Homecoming form in this issue of the M-Fanfare, and a separate MMB69 participation information will be coming to you via email.

Our Master Roster currently consists of well over 7,000 former members.

# The Forgotten Band Tour Part II

### Jazz Revolution!

Lanny Austin and Jose Mallare '62



From the Spring 2009 MFanfare: Most U of M Band alums know about the wonderful tours that have been taken by our Symphony Band and Wind Ensemble through the years, but few know about the 1965 U of M Jazz Band Tour.

The Jazz Band left Ann Arbor on January 23, 1965 and returned almost 3 and a half months later on May 2nd. During this period we performed more than 100 concerts in 46 cities in 15 countries including Guatemala, British Honduras, Honduras, Nicaragua, Panama, Ecuador, Bolivia, Paraguay, Surinam, British Guiana, Venezuela, Curacao, Trinidad and Tobago, Dominican Republic, and Jamaica. The Jazz Band was made up of students from several different departments within the University. Approximately 10 students were members of the Symphony Band and two had also gone on the 1961 Russian Tour. Our faculty advisor was Richard Crawford who also served as the MC for all of the concerts....

### The story continues:

In the larger cities, the Jazz Band did have several more formal performances including those in theaters and radio- television studios. A few of *those* audiences were surprisingly sophisticated for the 1960's. For example, we gave some concerts and clinics that were attended by several local musicians and "jazz club" members, and in Trinidad there was even an excellent jazz pianist who sat in with us.

Alas, there were also a few appearances where Communist sympathizers in the audience heckled and bombarded us with paper airplanes inscribed with "CUBA SI, YANKEES NO!" However, Santo Domingo but after only throconcerts there, on April 24th, the scheduled radio interview and concert for that evening were suddenly cancelled because of an ensuing revolution! So much for

was mostly wonderful, even though many in our audiences were completely new to jazz. As for any political influence we U of M were hurriedly moved to another many spots" where the active politicos warmed to us as we interacted with them before and after our concerts.

Musically we covered a wide range of jazz styles including Stan Kenton, Woody Herman, Quincy Jones, Count Basie and Bill Holman among others. Our biggest "hits" overall may have been some of the more accessible numbers like Glenn Miller's "In the Mood", a small group Dixieland version of "When the Saints Go Marching In" and our vocal/big band version of the (oh so new) Beatle's tune "A Hard Day's Night". We also occasionally "wowed them" with some jazzy or rock & roll versions of their own country's hit songs or folk music, all quickly arranged by Bruce Fisher upon arrival in that particular country.

Toward the end of the tour there was a very dramatic and interesting change in our itinerary. Our last two scheduled countries were to be Haiti and Jamaica: however we were diverted instead to the Dominican Republic at the other end of the island of Hispaniola. We were told the US State Department had decided our presence in Haiti might be used for inappropriate political purposes by then Haitian dictator Papa Doc. We set up base in the capital city of Santo Domingo but after only three concerts there, on April 24th, the scheduled radio interview and concert for that evening were suddenly cancelled because of an

"the show must much of the city and as the fighting got close to our hotel we were hurriedly moved to another one just outside the city a mile or so up the road. The next morning we went to the roof of our new "home" to watch Dominican planes bomb and strafe the capital including our former hotel. Those next two days were full of consternation to say the least. The hotel staff totally abandoned and those of us with a stash of any food became very popular ("food" in this case meaning candy bars from one of the last standing vending machines.) Our families at home were extremely worried as they followed the alarming news reports because all communication between us was impossible for three days.

At 5:00 am on April 27th the Jazz Band members, along with hundreds of other Americans including embassy staff, were told to wait on the lawn in front of the hotel in order to be evacuated by US Marines, who were ostensibly on the way. We were only allowed to bring as much as we could carry in one trip with two hands and of course this meant leaving a lot of our equipment behind. As the hours went by and the sun grew hotter in front of the hotel, a few of our guys took out their instruments and broke at least some of the tension by playing bossa novas while sitting on their suitcases. But then, as more warplanes zoomed overhead a rebel apparently attempted to hide in our midst and all kinds of shooting erupted around us. Everyone had heard the movie phrase "hit the dirt", and now we

instinctively knew exactly what it meant. Those of us who had suitcases and large instruments and who had been cursing their bulkiness were now glad to be hiding behind them.

After about 45 minutes, the commotion subsided and everyone was elated to see US military trucks driving toward us. There was It surely was for us! little hesitation in our boarding them for a welcomed ride to the seaport where, after yet another tension-filled 5 hours, we were finally evacuated by Navy ships overnight to a US base in Puerto Rico from which we belatedly flew to our last destination (Jamaica) the next day. An exhausted and emotionally drained band appeared in those final few concerts in Kingston and Montego Bay, but it sure was therapeutic to be playing music again!

A few days later the band let out an unrehearsed cheer the moment our plane touched down at Willow Run Airport in Ypsilanti, Michigan. We were greeted by a host of reporters and TV cameras wanting the "real lowdown" regarding the Dominican revolution and our 100

What a ride!

It goes without saying that there is a special pride for every student who has been fortunate enough to have participated in any of the U of M Bands. And if you are one of those bandsmen lucky enough to have also gone on a major tour, well, here's betting it was one of the biggest highlights of your life.

And to all you students now enrolled in a jazz-related class -PLEASE KEEP THAT FLAME **BURNING** - it has not always been

# Regional Alumni Band Guidelines

To provide support and guidance to regional or local University of Michigan Alumni Band Groups around the country and around the world.

- 1. Each local alumni band unit will have a designated director to coordinate the local band. The director will be responsible for scheduling events, scheduling rehearsals, and making sure that any engagement accepted by the local band is commensurate with the performance standards of the University of Michigan Bands. Any person playing in a local band shall have been a member of one of the Michigan Bands during their university tenure.
- 2. The director will be the liaison to the UMBAA to maintain contact and get any support measures needed that are available from the UMBAA or directly from the University of Michigan Bands.
- 3. Good instrumental balance is essential in assuring a good performance that reflects well on the talent of the local band members.
- 4. Performances should be of a nature that reflect positively on the local alumni band unit and on the University of Michigan Band program.
- 5. All members of a local alumni band unit are encouraged to rehearse before scheduled events and garner support for the University of Michigan Bands from their local alumni clubs when possible.
- 6. All members of a local alumni band unit are strongly encouraged to help support the University of Michigan Band Alumni Association by becoming active supporting members (members in good standing).
- 7. The Michigan Marching Band Director will provide any music requested that is traditionally a "Michigan" piece if the Board of Regents holds copyright. Any other requested pieces will need to be purchased by the local band.
