Ask any MMB member from the class of 2012 — the last four years of Michigan Football have not been easy to swallow. So as my fellow tuba players and I gathered around the TV at the end of the season for the Bowl Selection Show, our placement in a BCS game seemed absolutely surreal.

Preparing for the trip with a four hour rehearsal a few days after Christmas hardly seemed like a burden with the anticipation of warm weather, Cajun cooking, rich culture, and an eleventh win to the football record.

Stepping off the plane and onto the tarmac at the New Orleans Airport was a "moment" as we shed our winter coats and rolled up our sleeves. The weather was ideal our entire time in NOLA – not too hot, not too cold, and a complete absence of precipitation.

For halftime, we brushed up on the Techno/Rave Dance Party Show that we had played at the Under The Lights game against Notre Dame earlier in the year.

The show included "What Is Love/ Till The World Ends," "Harder Better Faster Stronger," and "Heaven/Everytime We Touch." To meet the time constraints set for us, we had to cut one song entirely from the original show and shorten another song. Additionally, some new drill was added for a seamless transition between tunes. In New Orleans, we practiced at Tad Gormley

Stadium, about a ten minute bus ride from our hotel in the French Quarter.

Aside from an unforgettable gameday performance in one of the most awe-inspiring indoor sports arenas in the country (although no match for the Big House, of course), it was the block party a couple days before the game that will always hold a special place in my memory. As you know, the MMB is notorious for a little thing we like to call "hurry up and wait." It's basically self-explanatory, but it involves the entire 300+ body of members standing or sitting idly in one location and then being alerted to immediately spring into action and be ready for whatever comes at us next. In perhaps its most ridiculous manifestation to date. we were gathered in the lobby of the hotel and proceeded to sprint down the sidewalk, across Canal St. – one of the busiest streets in the French Ouarter of New Orleans – where traffic was stopped for us, and then were told the city's nicknamed The Big Easy. we had to squeeze into a space way smaller than we needed that would severely distort our standard concert arcs. The space turned out to be slightly more accommodating than expected, and hearing Team 132 captains and coach speak in addition to Dave Brandon and Frank Beckmann made for an authentic Michigan experience that pumped up all in attendance.

The city of New Orleans was a gracious host, but it took me at least a day to fully appreciate their Southern hospitality. Our

first meal in the hotel was a famed 'Po-Boy,' but everyone joked that it was nothing more than a couple pieces of bread with meat between. As we ventured out into the city, though, our culinary explorations led us to delicious dishes including gumbo, jambalaya, pistolettes, crawfish, alligator, and (of course) beignets for dessert.

As far as tourist

attractions in New Orleans, it wasn't as much about specific monuments or buildings, but rather an overall feeling created by streets filled with breathtaking architecture and jazz music that made it easy to understand why We took a steamboat cruise, and I went to the aguarium and took a trolley ride on my own time. Strolling the French Quarter was





ultimately my favorite activity, though.

I'm sure no one really needs a full game recap, but from my perspective, watching the ball go through the uprights in overtime prompted one of the most

euphoric moments in my entire life. We may not have deserved the win, but it felt darn good walking away with one!

As is true with anything related to the MMB, the best part about the trip was being able to do everything in the company of great friends, excellent leadership, and unending support from alumni and fans. Go Blue!

The professorships are named after alumnus Arthur F. Thurnau. Recipients receive \$20,000 to support teaching activities, including travel, books, equipment and graduate student support.
