Dr. John Mohler Receives UMBAA Lifetime Achievement Award

On November 3, the Symphony, Concert, and Marching Bands each presented spectacular performances at the Band-O-Rama concert. A particularly special moment was when Dr. John Mohler, Professor of Clarinet Emeritus, was honored by the UMBAA with their Lifetime Achievement Award. Prior to attending U-M, Dr. Mohler served as Principal Clarinetist and Soloist with the Marine Band. Dr. Mohler earned three degrees from University of Michigan, and served as professor of clarinet from 1962 to 1994.

The award citation states, in part: In recognition of your outstanding participation in and loyal service to the University of Michigan Bands throughout a distinguished career as a performer, teacher, and mentor. The gifts of pedagogical perception, musical insights, and personal warmth remain the hallmarks of your teaching for generations of your former students. The contributions you and your students made to the various UM Bands as performers also set a very high standard for clarinetist around the country as well as for our current faculty and students. Through the years, your humble and sincere demeanor

inspiringly served those with whom you worked and enabled them to perform at a level worthy of our best traditions.

During his years at U-M, Dr. Mohler chaired the Winds/Percussion Division, performed in the faculty quintet, performed in the Toledo and Plymouth Symphony Orchestras, performed recitals locally and on tour, and was thoroughly dedicated to his students. It is significant that many of his former students currently perform professionally or teach at universities around the country. Indeed, over 20 former students showed up in Salt Lake City, UT and performed on stage for him when the International Clarinet Society presented a similar Lifetime Achievement Award only a few years ago. Congratulations John Mohler!

Grey skies and rain were constant during our annual homecoming "Blast" but there was no gloom in Ann Arbor. How could there be? Having one more chance to march and play in that special stadium put a smile on every returning alumni face. Old friends were reunited and new friendships with future alumni were created. The final glow was from the football team shutting out the University of Illinois by the score of 45 to 0.

Blast 2012 started Friday evening with the annual UMBAA barbecue and Alumni Band rehearsal conducted by UMBAA Director John Wilkins, who was his usual energetic self, firing us up and reminding us how long it has been since some of us played our instruments. The annual UMBAA business meeting started Saturday morning at the

relatively relaxed hour of 9:00 AM by President Sheri Chisholm with over 350 in attendance. Members Rich Alder, Gail Ferguson Stout, and Garry Straffon were honored for their years of selfless, dedicated work on behalf of UMBAA. UMBAA owes these three a huge debt of gratitude. In addition, a Special Citation was presented to Dr. Jeff Grogan in recognition of his "meritorious service to the University of Michigan Bands as Assistant Director of the Michigan Marching Band, and as Interim Director of the Michigan Marching Band, as well as his advocacy for music education throughout the United States."

Three 40-year anniversaries were honored at this year's Blast. 2012 celebrated the 40th anniversary of Title IX legislation, which resulted in the 1972 band being the first to include women. Three of these women, Marjie Janson Harcourt, Carolyn Good Kibbe, and Gwen Matheys led the band across the field during our pre-game ceremonies. In addition, 2012 was the 40th anniversary of the 1972 Super Bowl Band and the 40th anniversary of "Bullwinkle" written by Albert Ahronheim. While written for a cartoon show, Ahronheim's arrangement is still played at most football, hockey, and basketball games and still causes students to dance with "antlers" on their heads. Former Drum Major Albert Ahronheim is also the arranger of Calyptors, Hoover Street Rag, the universally played Let's Go Blue and led the Alumni Band at this year's Blast. If that wasn't enough, 2012 was the 50th anniversary of Jerry Bilik's Temptation.

In addition to the usual attendees, John Bacon, author of Three and Out: Rich Rodriguez and the Michigan Wolverines in the Crucible of College Football was in attendance. Mr. Bacon is in the process of writing a new book on college football and wants to include the band's

perspective, and spent the morning interviewing band alumni for stories for the book.

The UMBAA "Senior Band" joined MMB on the field in the Big House in a performance of George Gershwin's classic *I've Got Rhythm*. The groups joined forces on *I Want to Go Back to Michigan, Calyptors, Temptation, and War Chant*.

HOMECOMING

OF WOMEN AND BULLWINKLE – a Homecoming Retrospective

In the forty-first week of the fortieth year since Title IX became the law of the land, slightly more than forty members of the 1972 Michigan Marching Band returned to Ann Arbor for Homecoming on October 13, 2012. As proclaimed across the front of the bright yellow shirts they wore, it was a time to celebrate the 40th anniversaries of both women and Bullwinkle in the MMB.

Of the original eleven women to march in the band, six sent their condolences, but three were able to take out instruments and march out on the field. Those included the entire 1972 women's alto sax section, Gwen Matheys and Marjorie Jansen Harcourt, plus Carolyn Good Kibbe who fulfilled a life-long dream and marched with her flute (in 1972 she had played alto horn). In one of the wonderful side stories of the day, Carolyn became very good friends with Doris McNabb, also a flutist and the oldest marcher in the Alumni Band. Doris played in Concert Band in the 1940's, but has become a Homecoming regular. Although she was not allowed to march when in school, it was very fitting to see her team up with one of the original female marchers.

The Bullwinkle tradition in the MMB began in the fortieth week of 1972 with the cartoon show, the first MMB arrangement written by Albert Ahronheim, who also began his three-year stint as drum major that year. Adding to the excitement of Homecoming, Albert returned for the first time in many years,

and many of his arrangements were played in the course of the day.

Prior to the morning meeting/ rehearsals, videos were shown of the 1972 MMB performances at the Ohio State game and Super Bowl VII (Ironically, the star of the Super Bowl finale, Andy Williams, passed away less than three weeks before Homecoming). A special luncheon was held in the Coliseum after the morning rehearsal, and as the Alumni Band was announced at pregame, they were led across the field by the forty-some members of the 1972 MMB, attired in their yellow shirts. As a side note, the most popular shirt size ordered was extra large. But that was to be expected. After all, XL is the Roman numeral for 40!

Last summer, many of you who participated in the 2012 UMBAA survey asked us about band photos. You wanted to know where to find them, and wondered if more alumni photos could be made available. We listened! And here are the answers to your questions.

MMB Photo Video

Every football Saturday you see them: the lucky photographers on the field with the MMB. They've got video cameras, tiny cameras clipped to tubas, zoom lenses, you

name it. What you might not know is that they are at the morning rehearsal. They are in the press box. Every season, they are in the sky above The Big House and Ann Arbor. If the MMB is there, so are they. They are the hardworking team behind MMB Photo Video.

According to Tim Demske (Video Team Coordinator), MMB Photo Video was formed in 2009 because the band "needed a better way to reach MMB members, family, friends and fans." Their photographers, many of whom are MMB Alumni, have been taking photos of the band since the 1970s. More recently, to meet the changing needs of the band, MMB Photo Video has actually split into two businesses. "Michigan Marching Band Photography" is dedicated to photos. "MMB Photo Video" offers recordings of the MMB as well as other concerts and events (including the UMBAA Concert Band performances).

While most of the photos are of the through today), over a million MMB, photos of other athletic and campus bands are also available. Dick Gaskill is a very familiar face around the MMB for over 53 years! Dick started photographing the MMB for the Michigan Daily, while he was a student at Michigan. But his career as a band

photographer didn't truly begin until his own brother Tom (an MMB and Symphony Band member) introduced Dick to Dr. William Revelli. Tom asked Dr. Revelli if the bands needed a photographer and Dr. Revelli said yes. That was the beginning of a beautiful friendship. In Dick's own words, he "just can't give it up."

Fourteen Rose Bowls. A Super Bowl. The 1984 World Series at Tiger Stadium. A month in Europe with the Symphony Band in 1984. You name the place, Dick has been there, photographing the Michigan bands. Even though in 1997 he limited his coverage to only band events in Ann Arbor, that doesn't mean he is any less busy. Dick is something of a "Band Historian."

87.000 negatives (from 1953 prints, 30,000 digital files and more. His website (www.dickgaskill.printroom.com) is home to many photos from 2001 through today. Photos from before 2001 can also be found on the site. albeit in more limited numbers. The older photos found on the site are the ones that personally interest Dick or that have been requested by alumni "when they want to recall past times when they were in the Band." There is even a gallery of Michigan Band drum majors since 1913.
